## **Lodging and Travel Information**

There are two main hotels in Hanover that are convenient for the purpose of the conference: The Hanover Inn (<a href="www.hanoverinn.com">www.hanoverinn.com</a>) and the Six South Street Hotel (<a href="www.sixsouth.com">www.sixsouth.com</a>). They are a bit pricey but within five-to-ten-minutes' walking distance of the main venues for the conference.

If you have your own vehicle, you might consider staying at the Courtyard by Marriott Hotel, 10 Morgan Drive, Lebanon, NH 03766, tel. 603 643-1578. It is a 7 minute drive to Hanover.

There are also several b&b and airb&b options in Hanover, NH and Norwich, VT (a 30-ominute walk across the river), which you could explore as well. #### **Travel**

There are several options for your travel to Hanover. There are 3 local airports: Boston Logan, MA; Manchester, NH; or Lebanon, NH. From Boston Logan, you can take the Dartmouth Coach, which offers frequent, comfortable, and convenient express bus (3 hours) service to Hanover, and drops you at the Hanover Inn, across from campus. There is also a twice-daily Dartmouth Coach service to and from New York City (<a href="http://www.dartmouthcoach.com/">http://www.dartmouthcoach.com/</a>). You can fly into Manchester, NH, rent a car and drive (1.5 hours from Hanover on highways, fairly straightforward) and the foliage should be beautiful. The Lebanon, NH airport is very small with limited service to and from Boston Logan and New York City, and is a short 15 minute ride from Hanover. ## **Parking on Campus**

Parking in any campus lot without a pass is fine on Friday after 4pm and all day Saturday. If you arrive on Friday with a car, you can park on the street. There is metered parking along North Main Street and College Street (and elsewhere), which is convenient to Haldeman and Rauner Library, where most of the events will be, until 5pm and the machines take credit cards). On Saturday, parking is allowed in any lot on campus. Please consult the map.
